Cleaning Out the Closet

I hate junk and clutter. I can't find what I need. It makes a mess. It looks terrible. And yet, despite my dislike of clutter. Psalm 55:22 says, "Cast your cares upon the Lord and he will sustain you...." And finally, addressing the value that you and I have in the eyes of God, consider the words of 1 John 3:1, "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!"

Eventually, I get so fed up with some corner that I have allowed to get cluttered that I tackle it. I'll organize some of it, throw out portions of it and get it cleaned. Doing so, even if it was something small, brings so much peace and satisfaction. I want to encourage you, as a follower of God, clean out the spiritual corners of your life. When you have found yourself worrying, anxious, stressed out, or feel sin crouching at your door, clean those areas of spiritual life. Throw off the sin, give your cares to the Lord and understand that you are his child. Find your value and worth in him.
