Sermon Thought:

We know very little about the woman account from Luke 7 other than that she was a "sinner." In this account, the Pharisees and sinners are contrasted and interestingly, the sinners come out ahead. Only those who realize the depth of their sin can appreciate the complete forgiveness that God offers them.

Running The Race

Jim Thorpe, an Oklahoma Native American who ran in the 1912 Olympics. Just hours before he was set to compete in the Olympics, he realized that someone had stolen his shoes. Did he quit, no, he found two mismatched shoes in a trash can. One was too big, so he improvised with an extra pair of socks to fill the space. Jim went on to win two gold medals and one silver medal. This is one of several times he overcome adversity and did so with victories.

Reading about Jim Thorpe made me think of the Apostle Paul and all the adversity he had to overcome during his missionary journeys. We have just studied about those journeys in the book of Acts. Think how easy it would have been for Paul to just say it's not worth it, but he continued with his race to spread the gospel. I Corinthians 9:24-27 says: "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every athlete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we imperishable. So, I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control, lest after preaching to others I, myself, should be disqualified."

Paul and Jim Thorpe set a good example for us to never give up but continue to run our race of life no matter the adversity we may face. In Matthew 28:20, God promises that he is with us always to the end of the age.
