Taste and See

The holiday season is full of all kinds of special flavors: Pumpkin Spice, Apple Cinnamon, Eggnog. The list could go on. One of my family's favorites is peppermint and chocolate chip cookies. We first tasted them about 5 years ago and they have been tradition since then. There really is no way to know if you will like a new food until tasting it. A person could look at it, read the ingredients, smell it or even ask someone else what it is like to get an idea if it is good. But the verdict has to wait until that first bite.

Psalm 34:8 applies the idea of taste to knowing God. It says, "*Taste and see that the Lord is good...*" The premise is simple, just try God out, get a small sample. Doing so will open a person up to the amazing God of all creation. He won't spoil, he's not sour or bitter. God is good.

Unfortunately, too many are willing to pass judgement without ever experiencing God. It is possible to look at God's works, read about God, even ask others about him. But all of those are just keeping him at arm's length. There is no way to truly know his goodness until one has experienced him.

Here are a few verses to consider. Matthew 11:28, "**Come** to me, all who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest," Matthew 7:7, "**Ask**, and it will be given to you," Malachi 3:10, "**Bring** the whole tithe into the storehouse...Test me in this...and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven..." Notice that each requires a little effort on our part to experience him. That is the "taste" portion that Psalm 34:8 refers to. God is not going to force himself upon us. Instead, he calls for us to test him, give him a try. Doing so will reveal a God who is good beyond our wildest imagination.

By the way, if you want to try the peppermint cookies, here is how. Take your traditional chocolate chip cookie recipe, reduce the sugar a bit, add 12 crushed candy canes to the mix and cook them on parchment paper...you're welcome.
