And there are times when trust comes easy, but I'd be lying if I said it was easy all the time. Following God is an adventure and adventures include the unknown. Follow God into the unknown. Consider the words of Psalm 20:7, "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God." Trust God, give him a chance to prove himself.
