The Battle for our Children and Grandchildren's Hearts and Souls

A recent article in *Power for Today* titled "It Takes an Army," motivated me to write this. Please read the article below, followed by some thoughts of my own.

"As a young girl, our daughter was extremely susceptible to peer pressure. All anyone had to do to insure her unquestioning cooperation was to threaten, 'I won't like you if you don't....' As we disciplined her for her childish misdeeds, our minds boggled and our hearts quailed at the prospects of the more serious peer pressure of the teen years ahead."

"I confided my worries to my mother, who, without a word, undertook to pray for our daughter, specifically by name. She prayed our daughter through the 'mean girl' years of middle school, through the insecurities of junior high, and the pressures of high school and college. Our daughter developed into a strong, godly woman, and she will tell you it is, in part, my mother's doing. She says, 'I wanted to do all those stupid things that teenagers and college kids do, but I couldn't. Grandmother was praying for me."

"The battle for the souls of our children is real and serious. Enlist every soldier in your army that you can, and volunteer to be in the armies of others." – Article by Bill Moudy of Shallowater, Texas.

This article caused me to think about how concerned I have been that Americans are letting sports become their idol. Look at how much time people spend talking about sports with their children and adults. Think about how parents are so busy getting their children back and forth to sports games and practices that the whole family is stressed out. Consider how much money people spend to attend college and professional games. Don't get me wrong, there are some great lessons for children to learn by being involved in sports: working well with others, self-discipline, being a good loser (or winner), and so much more.

However, many Americans have somehow decided that sports is their top priority and that their children have to become "the best" at whatever sports they are involved in. So they start them young and spend lots of money and time to help them get so good they can earn scholarships for college (or even get into the pros). Meanwhile, their souls are being neglected.

I pray that each of you are putting your priorities where they need to be: in the battle for your children and grandchildren's hearts and souls. Ask other Christians to be part of your "army" in this battle.
