A Spiritual Journey Spiritual Vision

Our vision during physical journeys can be hampered by the elements of Mother Nature, such as dense fog, heavy rain, and a blinding snow storm. Being able to see the road signs and traffic can also be tainted by our personal eyesight. These moments of impaired vision can make our journey treacherous and unsafe.

Vision is also an essential element of our spiritual journey. We need to be able to see where God is leading us so we can faithfully serve him in everything we do. My mind takes me back to what God did for the Israelites as they journeyed out of their bondage in Egypt. "And the Lord went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead them along the way, and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, that they might travel by day and by night" (Ex. 13:21). God has created within us a need to know where we are going, to look forward to what lies ahead, and to give us purpose and meaning in life. This is so important for our spiritual lives as Solomon tells us, "Where there is no vision, the people perish; but he that keepeth the law, happy is he" (Prov. 29:18). Our **spiritual vision** is focused on a mental image of what we want or where we want to be at some point in our life. We must open our spiritual eyes so we can see clearly where God wants us to be. Without a vision, we have no earthly idea where we will end up. As a matter of fact, we can be certain that it will not be where we want to be, just as Solomon said. We need a **spiritual vision** for our journey to guide us toward the objective of eternal life with God! That will remove Satan's obstacles that blocks our vision and allows us to see God's presence with us. It may not be a pillar of cloud or a pillar of fire, but he is ever present every moment of our lives through the Holy Spirit he has given us to provide us a **spiritual vision**.
