As we grow in love for Jesus, we find that we love what he loves and hate what he hates. We find that we want to be more like him in every way. It doesn't happen in an instant, but rather over a lifetime. We change. We change to become more like Jesus.

All of us who have had that veil removed can see and reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord-who is the Spirit-makes us more and more like him as we are changed into his glorious image. 2 Corinthians 3:18
