Full of the Spirit

Being full is essential for us to enjoy life and accomplish the desires of our hearts and make a difference in the world.

This same element of being full is also a key aspect of our spiritual journey. In this context, we seek to be **full of the Spirit**. The spiritual strength and energy we need to move us forward to our eternal destination is the dwelling of God's Spirit. This is what Jesus received as he began his earthly ministry. "Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form, as a dove, and a voice came from heaven, 'Thou art my beloved Son; with thee I am well pleased" (Lk. 3:21-22).
