When the apostles needed to appoint men to care for the Lord's church, they picked out men "full of the Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint to this duty" (Acts 6:3). Being **full of the Spirit** is essential for us to be able to proclaim the good news of the gospel of Christ and save lost souls. The stoning of Stephen testifies to this spiritual power. "But he [Stephen], full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God" (Acts 7:55-56). When we are **full of the Spirit**, we too will be able to do amazing things for our Lord. Just like Stephen, we will behold the glory of God and Jesus in everything we do.
