Matthew 4:18-22

Sermon Thought:

When Jesus called his followers he didn't lay out for them exactly what it would look like to follow him. As his ministry went on, he gave them hints, some as warnings, others as celebrations: "I did not come to bring peace," "they will hate you because of me," you will "receive a hundredfold," "great is your reward in heaven," "count the cost." Jesus' followers often had to give up quite a bit. Sometimes they had to walk into the unknown. We as a church are following Jesus. We don't know where all this is going or how it all works out, but we do know that our responsibility is to follow him.

Spiritual Maturity

The element of maturing is part of our life from the time we are born until we take our final breath. It is a basic part of the development process God created in us. We mature as we grow physically and learn from the experiences in various elements of life. As mature adults, we are able to use our God given abilities to be successful in the things we do and make a difference in the world around us.

Spiritual maturity is also a necessary part of our journey through life. As we give our lives to Christ, we are expected to grow spiritually, just as he did "...*in favor with God and man*" (Lk. 2:52). Our **spiritual maturity** comes from reading the Bible, being taught by our Bible class teachers, and the countless number of spiritual people God puts in our lives. When we fail to grow spiritually, it is noticed by those helping to mold our lives. "For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need some one to teach you again the first principles of God's word. You need milk, not solid food; for every one who lives on milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, for he is a child. But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their faculties trained by practice to distinguish good from evil" (Heb. 5:12-14). Our task as disciples of Christ is to step out in faith and do the work he has given us to do. That is how we gain experience and knowledge about what living in the kingdom is all about. Peter provides us with a powerful guide on **spiritual maturity**. "But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen" (2 Pet. 3:18). Our Christian life is an amazing spiritual journey when we submit ourselves to the Holy Spirit God gave us to guide our thoughts and actions, and to direct our steps. Our **spiritual maturity** makes it possible for us to do the will of our Father.
