Sermon Scripture: Ephesians 6:13

Sermon Thought:

In this passage of scripture, and several elsewhere, God's followers are told to "stand firm." Sometimes the images of wind or waves are used, but always, the point is that there are forces at work, pushing God's followers away from where they need to be. Some people think standing firm means attacking the world. Some think it means putting up a fortress of walls against the world. This sermon looks at what that means according to scripture.

Sermon Questions:

1. Share what it is like to have forces pushing and pulling you away from where you need to be in following God.

2. In what aspects of life do you feel the push and pull away from God the strongest?

3. What do you find helpful in combating the push and pull?

Our Daily Bread

In Matthew 6:5-13 Jesus gives instruction about prayer. Some of his instructions are that prayer is not to receive praise from the people watching, and prayer isn't made better by the length or number of words used. In Jesus' example of prayer, he uses the phrase, "Give us today our daily bread." This is a short but mighty example for us.

The idea behind this is one that is readily grasped, "God we ask that you give us just what need." Not too much, not too little. Proverbs 30:8-9 uses the same terminology and spells out the exact reasons why one doesn't need too little or too much, "Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say, 'Who is the Lord?' Or I may become poor and steal, and so dishonor the name of my God."

While it is easy to pray the prayer, it is not easy to live the prayer. If asked, "How much is enough?" Most would probably respond, "Just a little more." A little more pay, a bit bigger house, slightly nicer car. Perhaps we should add a phrase to our prayers, "Give us our daily bread...and to know when we have it." If we were to grasp that, perhaps then we would be more generous, maybe then we would be satisfied. Then we could rejoice in the blessings we have received instead of always searching for more.
