Revealing God

It Was Very Good

O how we cherish the good things of life. It is a very satisfying feeling when we can say "it was very good, for the things we do and eat. Granted, the goodness of life has a lot to do with what we make of it, but there are things that can interrupt what we intended. Our godly nature kicks in when we encounter road bumps on our journey. We find a way to work around the obstacles so we can keep going toward our desired destiny. It is a blessing when we can look back and say "*it was very good*?"

God set the example for us at the beginning of creation. After completing everything he created, he sat down and looked it all over. "And God saw everything that he had made, and behold, it was very good" Gen. 1:31).
