Is it not amazing, in our vast vocabulary of words and phrases and books we read and study, that much of life comes down to three little words. "I love you", "It's a boy!", "Congratulations you passed!" These are some of the best words we hear in this life.

Whin a month, she was having surgery. Within two, her chemotherapy began. Now, she is in remission, the best possible outcome that the doctors told us at the beginning of this journey. From the beginning, this church, you all stepped up, showed up, prayed us up, feed us, and blessed us more than words can say. We saw what the body of Christ can do, and it was and is, incredible.

We had people praying for us from Enid to the Philippines. Friends from college, who we hadn't talked to in years, were praying for us. Wow! The incredible reach and arm of Christ's body is everywhere. People we did business with reached out to tell their story of how they overcame cancer. Their testimony was heart wrenching and uplifting at the same time. Personally, I want to thank those (and there were many) who were bad for me on my bad days. When all I wanted to do was feel sorry for myself, break down, and cry. You had a warm heart, a listening ear, arms to hug, and a shoulder to break down and weep on. Truly there are angels among us, thank you, thank you, thank you!

I was worried about my wife. About so many things, spinning around in my head. But you were there. You were Matthew 6:25-34 for me. Jesus said don't worry. "Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?" No one knows how this will all end, but we do know we are loved, blessed, and taken care of. We love you.
