Revealing God – Messages from the Spirit

Spiritual Fulfillment

What makes us feel complete? When are things going our way? When we have what we want? When we have done something good for someone? When we are recognized for the things we do? I imagine the answer is different for each one of us, and it changes for the season of life we are in. Our human need to feel complete or satisfied is a natural one, and it is a primary motivation for how we conduct our lives. We want to know that we have done our best, and that people and organizations have been touched by our contribution.

God indeed wants us to feel complete. That is why he walks with us and guides us through his Holy Spirit. Solomon writes, "A man's mind plans his way, but the Lord directs his steps" (Prov. 16:9). God's presence with us is what gives us **spiritual fulfillment** as we go forth doing his good works. As his disciples began to implement his new covenant in Christ, "they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance" (Acts 2:4). You see, God makes sure we are equipped to carry out the mission he gives us. That is when things are going our way. That is when we have what we want. That is when we find ourselves doing something good for others. That is when the world recognizes that it is Christ that lives in us. The testimony about Stephen's courageous ministry clearly proclaims the reality of our **spiritual fulfillment**. "But he [Stephen], full of the Holy Spirit, gazed into heaven and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing at the right hand of God" (Acts 7:55). The work of the Spirit in our lives is to complete what God created. Acknowledging that we are his workmanship is what allows us to feel complete. Then we can have **spiritual fulfillment** and proclaim, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory" (Is. 6:8).
