Sermon Thought:

Jesus’ teachings constantly focus on what is going on inside a person, or the heart. What happens on the inside is what will be noticeable on the outside. For example, humbleness and faith are not characteristics that can be measured with a tape measure or measuring cup, but their effects can be seen. In the passage below, an officer amazes Jesus with his faith.

Follow God, Not Yourself

GPS is quite a wonderful tool. I remember the moment I realized maps were no longer needed when traveling because of GPS on smartphones. When organizing a two-week trip from Oregon to Mexico, I printed one map for each vehicle to each stop along our journey. When loading up, I handed a 3-ring binder to each driver, but one said, "Why do I need this?" I responded, "So you don't get lost if we get separated." He said, "But that is why I have my GPS. Just tell me where we are going." I stuck it in the vehicle when he wasn't looking, just in case they ran out of batteries, but that is the last time I printed off maps with instructions.

Now, there is a game I play with the GPS whenever I use it. The game is called "Beat the GPS estimated time of arrival" (no speeding allowed). I'm sure many of you do the same thing. You enter the destination; the GPS pulls up the "best" route and gives an estimated time of arrival. From that point, it's game on! It is me against the machine. Can I find a better way, a faster way, a shorter way? Surely, I can do better than some algorithm.

Unfortunately, we often treat God like the GPS. God has given us a path to take. He has considered the dangers along the way, but something inside says, "I know better; I'm going to do it my way".

The Bible is full of passages about the importance of following God's way. Consider: Deuteronomy 5:33, "Walk in all the ways the Lord commands so that life may go well," Joshua 22:5, "Be careful to love God, walk in his ways, and keep his commands," Proverbs 3:5-6, "Trust in the Lord and he will make your paths straight," and Ephesians 5:1-2, "Walk in the way of love, following Christ's example." Each of these passages tells us to stay the course that God has given us. Yes, there are other ways, but God has given us HIS way. We may think of a different way, an easier way, a way with less discomfort, but any other way is not of God. Stay the course, trust God, his ways are not our own...they are far superior.
