**The Essence of Life – The Blessing of Oneness  
Sacrifice**

The concept of sacrifice is a challenge to our human nature. Even in our young lives, we are reluctant to share the things we have – they are ours, and nobody else can touch them. Then, as we begin our journey through life, we work hard to get the things we need, and it often takes everything we have just to survive. How in the world can we bring ourselves to give up something that is valuable to us to help someone else or support a world need? As we embrace the essence of life, we discover that sacrifice is an essential part of the blessings God has in store for us. As Jesus tells us, *“It is more blessed to give than to receive”* (Acts 20:35). The reality of sacrifice is that when we give to help someone else, God extends to us his bountiful blessings.

When sin blemished the blessing of oneness that God created us to have with him, he established the law of sacrifice so we could remain close to him. That required sacrificing the best we had – an animal without blemish (Lev. 1:3). This process of sacrifice was indeed a challenge, but it kept us in a “oneness” relationship with our heavenly Father. Then God perfected the sacrificial process by sending his own Son to atone for our sins. *“He [Jesus] bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness”* (1 Pet. 3:24). What a tremendous sacrifice! Jesus, leaving the glory of heaven, took on human form and gave his life on the cross for us. God has now restored the blessing of oneness he created us to have. Because of what God has done for us, we must also be willing to sacrifice for the good of others. As the apostle Paul tells us to, *“present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship”* (Rom. 12:1). When we do that, we will be filled with his divine grace and receive his bountiful blessings.
