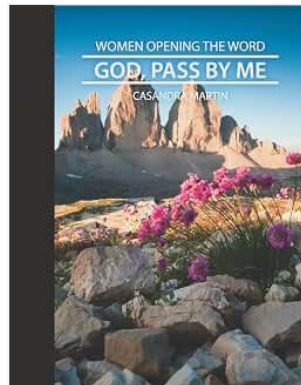
May God bless you as you have blessed these boys!
